




















My primary reason for taking the course.




The approximate number of classes or labs that I did not attend




Relative to other courses I have taken at UVic, the workload in this course was

the stories he tells, which always relate back to the course, are interesting and easy to remember. he posts the lectures and the lecture notes, so that you can refer back to them as the semester goes on. this makes it easier when preparing for the exams.
Great stories in lectures.
He's interactive and uses a variety of sources in the course material (ie. videos) which help better explain the concepts
I found Bruce's examples for each topic that he talked about to be very interesting and helpful, especially his stories. Though so students might not like the amount of them, I find them really entertaining and also it makes the topics more relatable to our lives. We're not just learning about a subject that we don't see as applying to us. Bruce really makes sure that we think about the course content and how it relates to our lives

Bruce is fantastically charismatic and a very engaging teacher, but perhaps a bit intimidating to approach. Ironically, he does not seem very receptive to student opinions which do not match his own. This makes class discussions fairly non-engaging because Bruce will always have the last word.

Dr. Ravelli is an amazing professor. His lecture notes are clear and concise, but his lectures themselves provide so much more insight into the material, making it fun and accessible. He presents the concepts in a variety of ways, from lecture notes, to personal stories, to videos, all of which are relevant and provide additional ways of looking at the material. I love that the exam questions are given out in advance, as it is not the kind of exam that one can simply memorize an answer to, but it allows for directed preparation and for questions to be asked regarding concept clarity.

The tutorials were not very helpful, because not all the leaders were super comfortable with the class.

TA was not good. Poor explanations, did not appear to know what he was doing

I found that this course lead me to the conclusion that the field of sociology is and to quote Bruce "Is complete and utter bullshit". I found it astonishing that individuals could work for years on concepts that lack any scientific merit whatsoever and actually reject biological concepts that have been proven with actual science. I would recommend Bruce needs to take an introductory Biology class in order to learn about some of the concepts he proceeds to mock in class. For instance Kamikaze sperm is an actual concept with some biological basis and Bruce proceeded to make a mockery out of the field of research, turning it into a joke. I found parts of this course to be deeply, deeply offensive to me.

Tutorials. My specific tutorial leader was often disorganized but I heard from other students their tutorial leaders were better. Information we were told that the tutorial leaders would cover was often not covered.

Nothing that Bruce did hindered my learning in this course. Sociology just isn't my strongest subject.

The focus on white male theorists was annoying, alongside some of Bruce's sexist comments in class. I didn't pay to hear the reinforcement of the gender binary and sexist notions of men and women's sex drives. This put me off the course and of Bruce.

The professor significantly hindered my progress in the course: his lectures were vague and unspecific (a five minute lecture and a six line blurb on Marx's alienation, which is an important sociological concept, does not actually help students understand anything). He "example only" lecture style does not actually teach enough content, and when asked to further explain, he uses only other examples. He is also unapproachable and comes of as egotistical, so there is no point in asking him for help. Because he wrote the textbook, both the lectures and the

textbook contain the same examples, so when asked to draw from both to study for exams, there is not nearly enough material to draw from and Wikipedia appears to be a better source. I was asked to define Post-Structuralism on the midterm, and then was told I was not detailed enough even though I had verbatim wrote the textbook definition, which was no more than two lines. I would recommend that he be forced to teach from another textbook, so that students are given the chance to study from another source which supplements lecture adequately. I would also recommend that his midterm/exam structure be re-evaluated, and that the grading scheme be more precisely laid out for both TA's and students. "I can't teach an A" is not a good enough answer when asked what an A looks like. Students shouldn't have to ask repeatedly.

Very little actually hindered my learning in this course. Sometimes, the videos he showed in class I felt were not overly applicable but that is my only complaint. If they were eliminated and replaced with more relevant course content, that could be better. The midterms are difficult, but with adequate studying they are doable.

Tutorial sections were extremely awkward, too small. It was kind of strange being the only male in a tutorial with 9 women and a female instructor and discussing BDSM for 50 minutes for instance.
