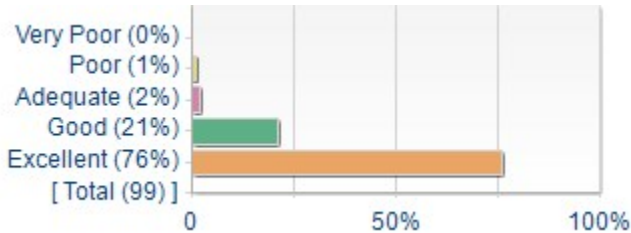

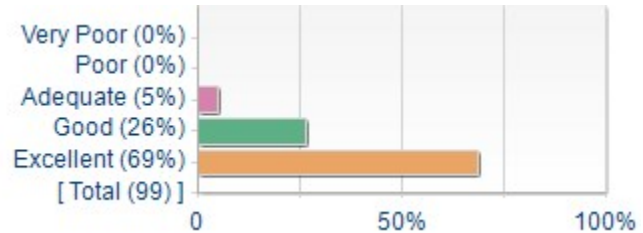

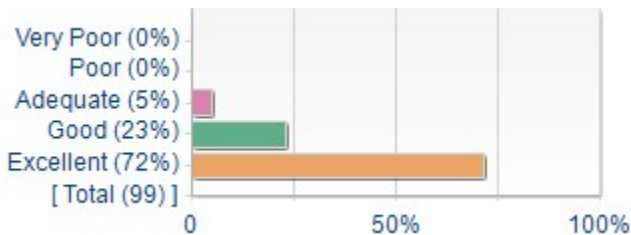

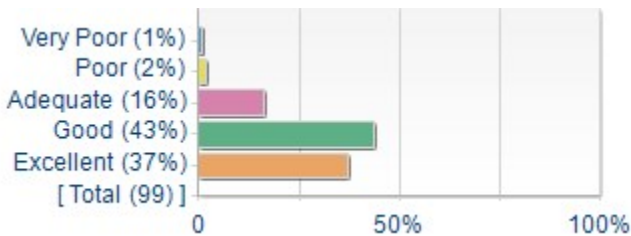

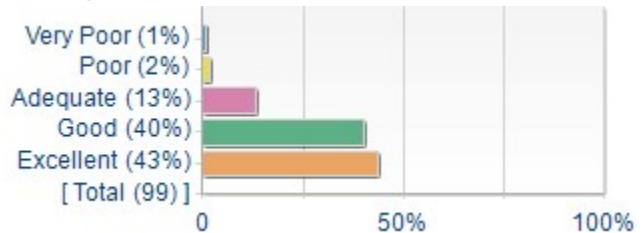

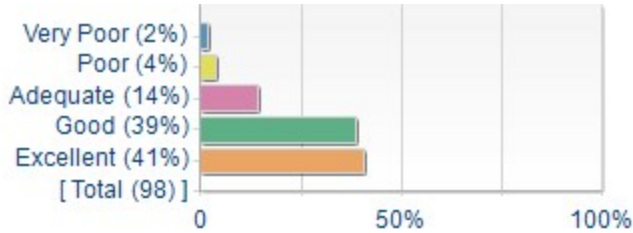

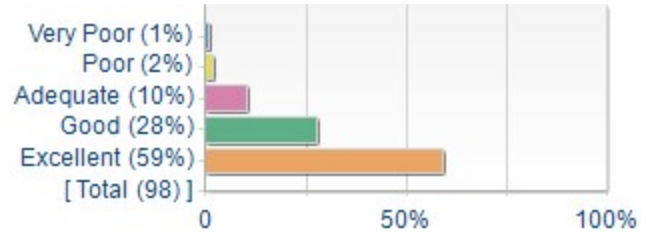

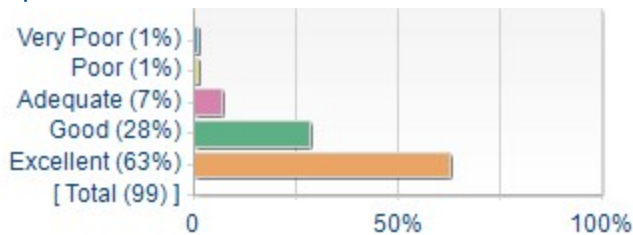

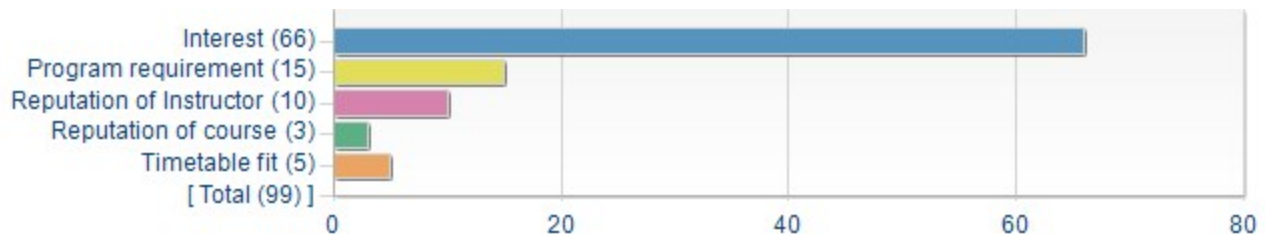

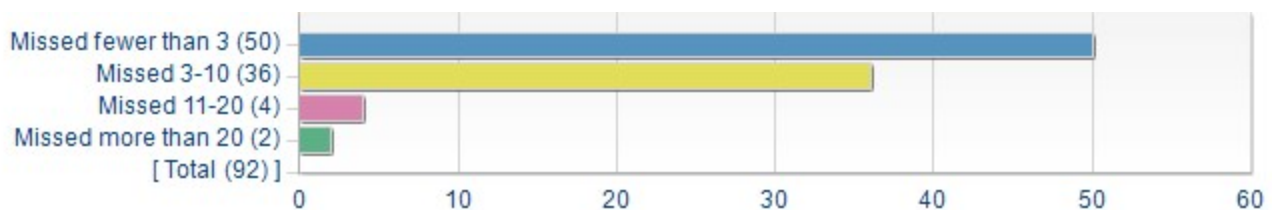

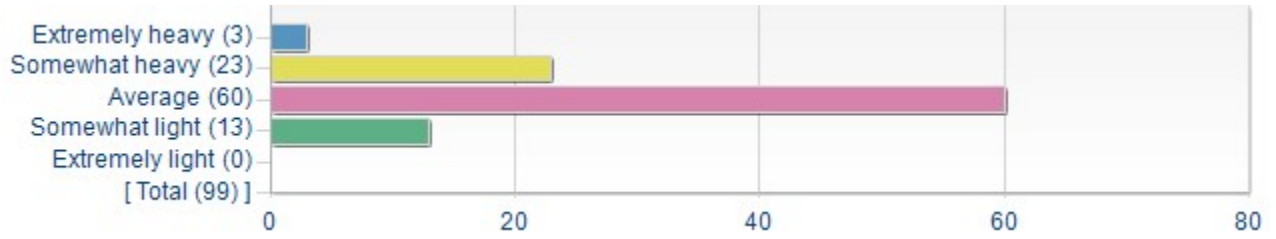
My primary reason for taking the course.



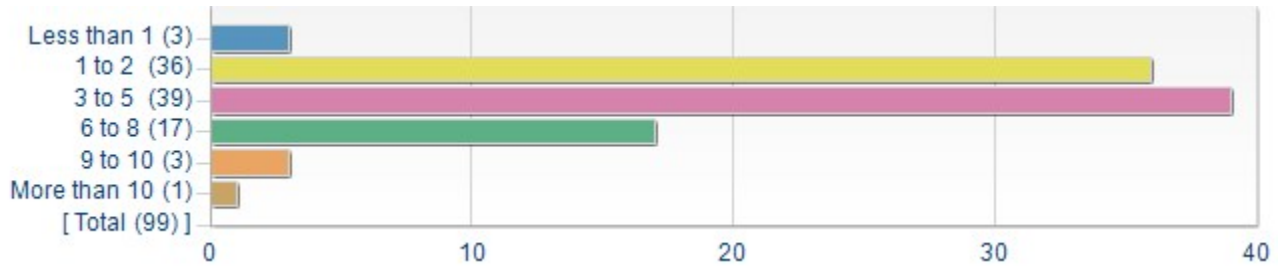
The approximate number of classes or labs that I did not attend

It would have been a more effective learning experience for me if the instructor had managed to stay away from using sweeping generalizations and hypotheticals during his lectures and had instead engaged in more concrete, real-life examples pulled from current events in order to illustrate his points. I personally found that it would also have been helpful if he could have refrained from making incensing statements purely for the sake of eliciting reaction, as the nature of the class limited debate and discussion and the constraint on time often resulted in students' comments being hurried or cut short.

I think there needs to be so much work done regarding the tutorials. I found them to be a waste of my time and every time I went to my tutorial i was disappointed by the experience. The tutorial teacher was not very helpful and rarely prepared. This really effected the way in which i viewed the class, the assignments and such. The class alone was helpful to some degree but the tutorials were very disappointing I feel like if more work went into preparing tutorial subjects and making sure the tutorial leaders are doing their job correctly and stimulating the students this would have been a much more enjoyable class.
I particularly enjoyed the tutorial assignments in this course. However, I found the midterms to be quite difficult. Although I'm a straight A student, I struggled to maintain a B average on the midterms. The midterms were all written responses. In order to achieve an A, students would have to identify, define, and describe concepts and then take the concepts a step further by applying personal examples. Although I felt that I had met all of these criteria, I still did not do well on the tests. I felt that in order to truly achieve an A, I would have to be able to read the TA's mind. To summarize, I felt that the marking in the course was purely subjective, and not objective. I feel that many students would have done much better on exams in this course if a multiple-choice or fill-in the blank section was used as opposed to an exhaustive written response that was subject to the restricted opinions of the marker. After getting my marks back from the midterm, I felt completely stupid. It did not help when Bruce commented to the class that many students had achieved A's.

On the second midterm I thought I was going to do better on the 100B exam than the 100A exam, based on my understanding of the questions asked. I ended up doing better on the 100A exam. This demonstrates in inconsistency of grading papers with numerous people. Maybe it is a better idea to have each paper marked twice, by two different TAs.

The my soc lab questions are a joke, most people just guess, take pictures of the answers and do them again. I went through and read the chapter to actually learn the material, this should be required to do good on the soc lab questions which are worth 15%. Otherwise, just get rid of them.

With their current outline, it is as effective as I can think of,

If a student is taking 100A & B at the same time, then the TAs should meet together when marking their assignments so that there isn't a difference of 5-15% (of assignment grade) in the marking. I personally would rather have had the mean grade for both tutorial sections than each separate grade.

Although it was nice that the online textbook quizzes were essentially free marks, I did not really find them effective. Another way to evaluate students understanding of the material in the textbook might be more effective.

I also had a hard time grasping some of the concepts in the theory portion of this course. Going to the textbook helped some of the time to clarify my confusion but most of the time, since Bruce wrote the textbook, if I did not understand the concept in class the textbook did not help me. Maybe offering supplementary readings to clarify those big concepts might be beneficial to future students.

Test are tough, but Bruce does provide adequate information.
