


























My primary reason for taking the course.




The approximate number of classes or labs that I did not attend




Relative to other courses I have taken at UVic, the workload in this course was

I think maybe it would be more clear to explain what transcending the material means to him, which would provide more clear expectations for the students.

More feedback on exams and papers would be helpful in improving my writing skills.
Sometimes when we are focusing on one topic - he will divert with a separate argument, and when somebody in the class tries to counter that argument, he will revert back to the slides and almost dismiss the students opinion.
Bruce could have helped me learn more effectively by trying to make the topics which were not so interesting, be taught from a different approach. Possibly more videos to help explain topics that are confusing or not as interesting as others.
Suggests some ideas that could help me develop further than the lectures (which is what he expects to see on midterms and final). This is because I don't really quite clear with what he wants to see to get that A.
The grading criteria for the assignments and midterms are very strict. I felt sometimes that the grading was too harsh and the assignments and midterms should have been explained more in order to grade at this level.
