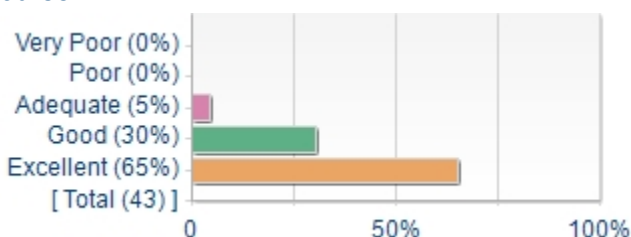

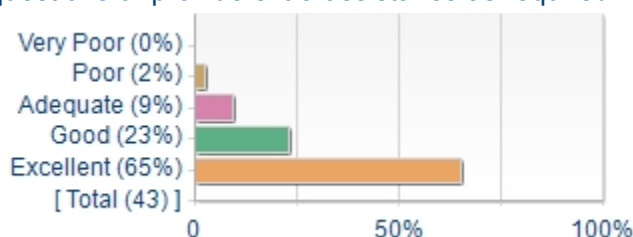

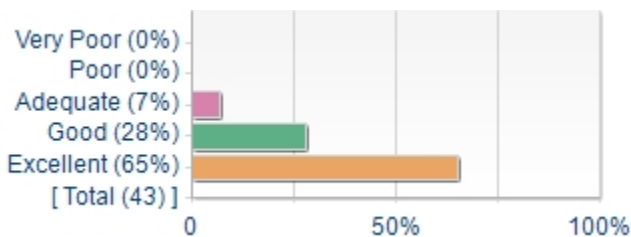

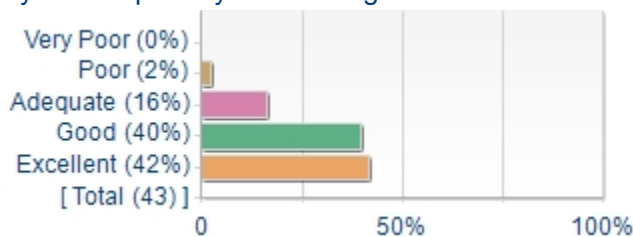

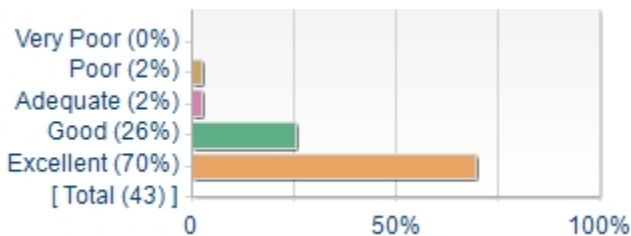

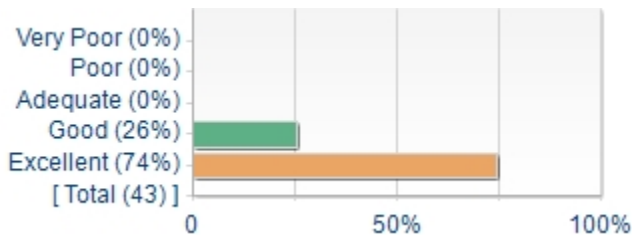

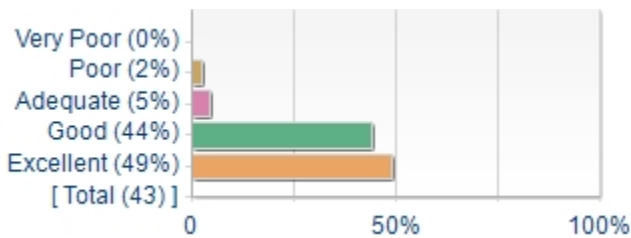

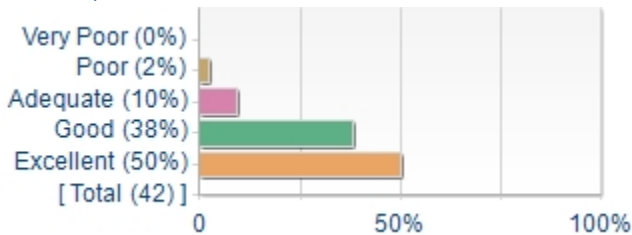

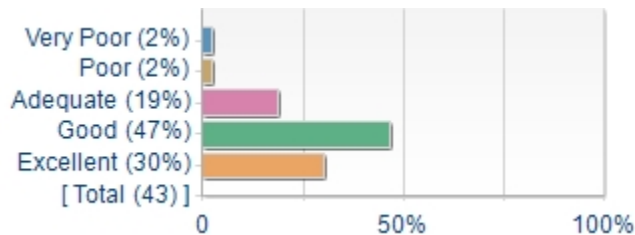

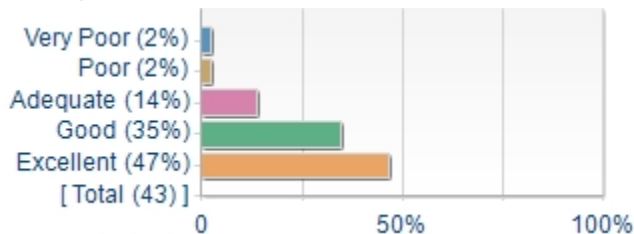

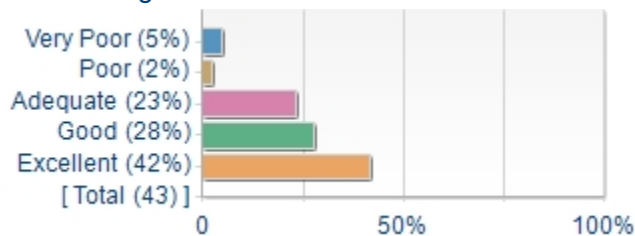

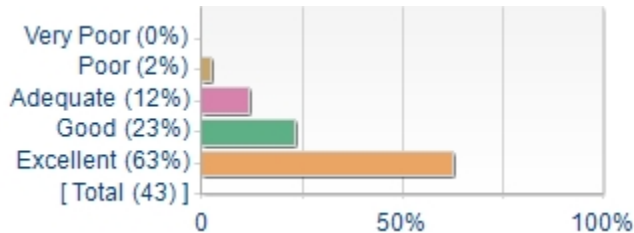

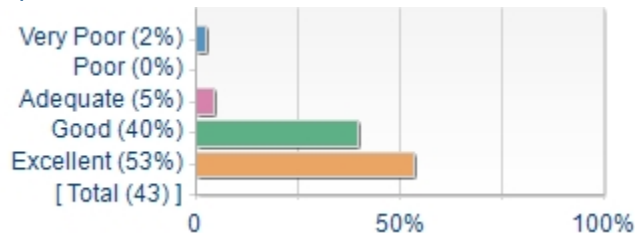

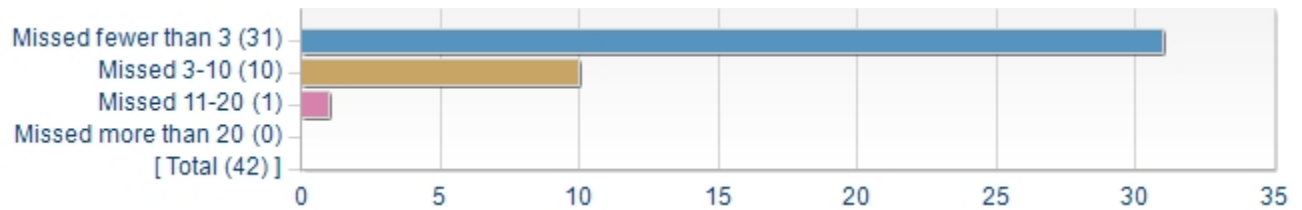

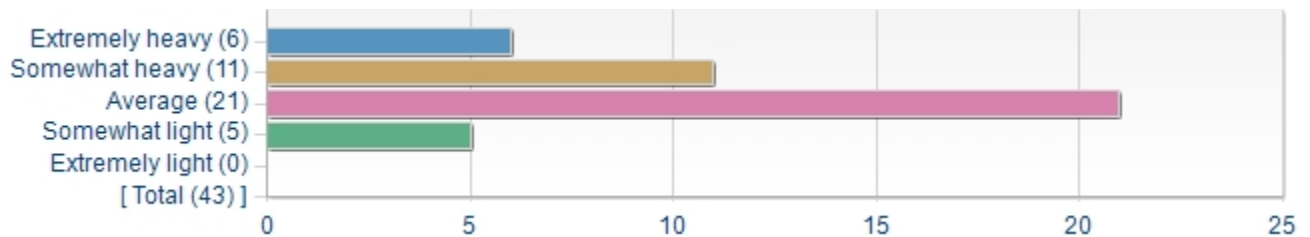

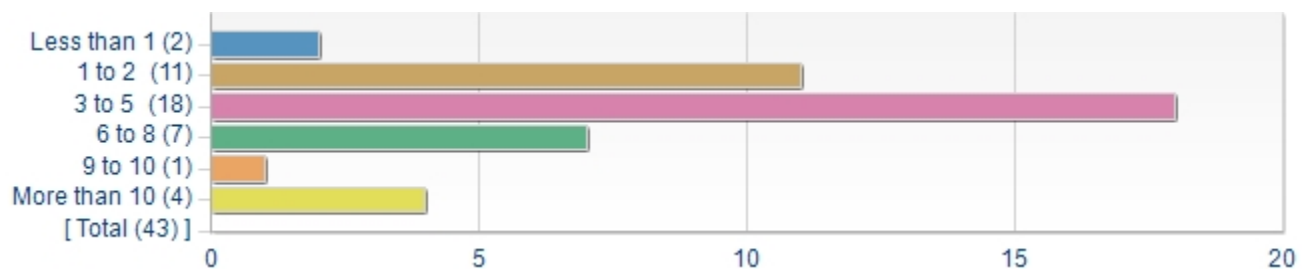
The approximate number of classes or labs that I did not attend



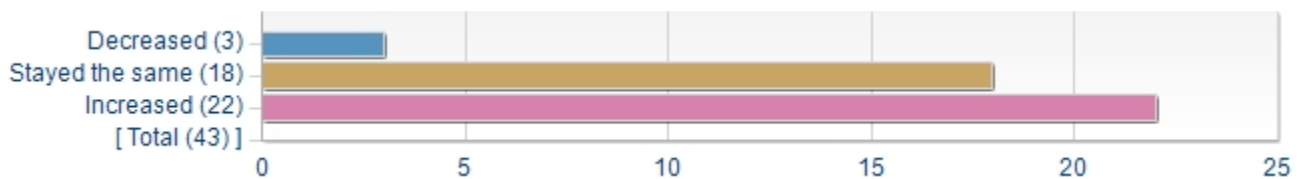
Relative to other courses I have taken at UVic, the workload in this course was

I don't think there is a way
More quizzes and surveys
I think for individuals who didn't do well on exams it was super discouraging to be basically told that providing correct definitions is only worth 50%. I understand that he is a harder marker, but I feel that I would have benefited from a deeper understanding of how a D grade is meant to motivate a student to perform well. The advice given for the following exam "get the B first" was frustrating, as I had completed the work for the B grade in the first exam and had received a D. I chose to go purely on personal experience and forgo the definitions and received a B+. So I feel the grading is a bit off, in that the personal experience is so heavily valued and the understanding of course material essentially devalued.
We had a student in our class who took up a lot of airtime, I do think that it would have been worthwhile to acknowledge that one person answered 75% of general (even rhetorical) questions. Reminding us that there are many voices we haven't heard would have been useful and encouraging for the other students who might not have been so encouraged to speak up in their lives outside of class.

provided some smaller assignments along the way to assist in checking your knowledge on key terms/ideas — not necessarily for marks, but some kind of easy (maybe multiple choice) "quiz" to help with understanding definitions
I found some of the information redundant as I it was not new information.
Occasionally Bruce was a bit hypocritical in his examples and what he said. I wasn't a fan of the way he kept stereotyping gender. I know it was to make a point but honestly its a bit old fashioned and its not necessary to perpetuate those stereotypes. Also some people in the class who do not have quality of mind may be taking you seriously.

Sometimes examples simplified the complexity of the concepts, and the opinion presented was very one sided. For example, in the religion section, the only theories presented were negative about religion and the overall tone seemed to be arguing that eastern religions are better than western religions.

More detail into what to do on assignments.
While I really enjoyed the format of the midterms and exams, it does create a scenario where you are writing four or six short papers for an intro course, really pulling away from your other courses.
For written exams, I think the requirements were too strict and compact, it would be better to have one question that we could answer in depth instead of scrambling to answer two questions on one page.
The test is really hard and heavy for me since we need to write several papers and remember them.
More smaller activities
More group discussions
Good course, I would have liked a deeper dive into questioning the terms and sociological tropes we talked about, but I understand that this is an entry level course and that might be a bit much for some students.
Posting exam questions earlier
I struggled with the sheer amount of writing for midterms in a condensed period of time, not sure if this is solvable, I just have very poor written output.

Group work
Bruce tells his students that the TA's for the course will tell the students how and what they look for in assignments and midterms, but as soon as students talk to the TA's about what they are looking for, TA's respond that they can't just simply "tell you what they are looking for"...so most tutorials just result in TA's reading the assignment – not very helpful at all.
Better marking rubric on assignments and midterms, as they are graded quite heavily and somewhat unfairly
1) This course does not recognize students' effort. As long as one does not meet the "standard", then even if one spends hours on the tests or assignment, one can still receive a fail grade. 2) Students' tests and assignments are marked by different TAs. Some TAs give extensive feedbacks, some just write a few sentences. 3) I enjoy every bit of the lectures, but the assignments and tests discouraged me a lot
I enjoy listening to bruce's stories, however, i found it difficult in many cases to see why we were being taught about them, while they may carry sociological significance, the connection the testable material was vague.
